The Baptism of Jesus

John the Baptist had been preaching repentance, calling people to turn from sin and prepare their hearts for the coming Messiah. Crowds came to him at the Jordan River to confess their sins and be baptized.

When Jesus approached John and asked to be baptized, John was stunned. He recognized that Jesus, the sinless Son of God, did not need to repent and insisted that *he* should be baptized by Jesus instead. However, Jesus explained that His baptism was necessary "to fulfill all righteousness," demonstrating His obedience to the Father and the official beginning of His earthly ministry.

As Jesus came up out of the water, something extraordinary happened. The heavens opened, the Holy Spirit descended like a dove, and the voice of God the Father declared, "***This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.***" This powerful moment confirmed Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah.

Jesus's baptism carried deep spiritual meaning. Though He had no sin to confess, His baptism symbolized His willing submission to the Father's will, His identification with humanity, and the start of His mission to bring salvation to the world.

This event also revealed the Trinity clearly, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, in perfect unity. The Spirit's descent symbolized divine empowerment for Jesus' ministry, while the Father's voice affirmed Jesus' identity and mission.

Additionally, Jesus' baptism served as a sign to John the Baptist and to future generations that He was truly the Messiah. With this confirmation, John's role of preparing the way for Christ was complete.







Cleaning up the Jordan

A group of pilgrims from the United States was traveling through the Holy Land. They wanted to walk where Jesus walked, eat what he may have eaten, smell the salt air that Jesus smelled.

On a cold day they came to the Jordan River, the spot where tradition says Jesus was baptized by John — but the site of the Jordan that day quickly erased the feelings of “magic” they had anticipated.

A member of the group, a Lutheran minister, describes the scene:

“The Jordan is a shallow, silt-filled river that carries agricultural runoff, sewage, and political unrest downstream. It’s too shallow to boat on and too polluted to swim in. The river marks a demilitarized zone between Israel and Jordan, its shores studded with armed snipers. The waters of the Jordan are diverted away from the Palestinian territories, contributing to one of the worst humanitarian crises in the world. Water is always in short supply in that part of the world: the country that “owns” the Jordan for both irrigation and consumption is the winner.”

The minister did manage to fill a small bottle with water from the Jordan. The hope was to use the water from the river where Jesus was baptized at the parish’s next celebration of Baptism, but “I flew all the way home from the Middle East with a vial of water from the Jordan in my carry-on bag. I stored it in a place of honor in my office, eager to uncork it for the next baptism. Several months passed. And by the time I went to mingle the local waters . . . with the exotic waters of the Jordan, my vial of holy water had turned to a vial of vile. Murky. Smelly. The bottom of the jar coated in sediment and the top in slime. I tossed it out, jar and all.”

The meaning of their experience at today’s Jordan River?

“In being baptized and in daily remembering our baptisms, we dip and rise, dip and rise. We are immersed in the often murky reality of faithful life in God’s world.”

[Our lives are filled with “baptismal” moments when we are “submerged” in the “murky,” turbulent waters of change, discovery, decision, illness, death. We are baptized into Jesus’ work of cleaning up those waters of sin and fear, of removing the dirt and silt of injustice and hatred, of restoring the springs of peace and compassion that God causes to spring up in our Jordan’s and Jerusalem’s. Baptism is not just a one-time ritual or milestone but a continuing experience of transformation in the spirit of Christ in the many “baptisms” we experience. Baptism is a daily experience of “plunging” into the murky depths of the human experience and rising in the light of God’s wisdom to transform those waters into life-giving springs of God’s love.]
