

As a result of 40 Days for Life campaigns, over 20,000 babies have been saved, and over 100 abortion centers closed so far.



Nearly 1 in 4 U.S. adults report living with some kind of disability, ranging from physical limitations to diminished mental capabilities. Misunderstandings

and misconceptions about a person's individual disabilities can put that person at risk for abuse. By adopting practices that aim to understand a person's unique circumstances, abilities, and challenges, we can work to protect those who are vulnerable in our communities. Some examples which can help foster safety and community include: asking questions instead of making assumptions, focusing on a person's abilities and using positive language. CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

The School of Religious Education is offering the Children's Liturgy of the Word for our parish Children during the 9:00 a.m. Mass. Please look for the banner in the opening procession and join us for the Children's Liturgy of the Word. The program is free to all our parish children ages 4-10.

The Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) is a wonderful time for children ages 4-10 to build their relationship with God in the company of their peers. With the help of a catechist, scripture, faith-based activities, and prayer are used to help the children explore their faith. Look for the banner in the entrance procession during the 9:00 a.m. Mass to confirm that CLOW will take place. Children are called forward by the priest to join their catechist and are dismissed to move to the Kateri Room for the session. The children will return to their family members during the collection.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) -THE FIRST RITE



The Rite of Welcome, the first public Rite of OCIA, will take place at St. John Baptist de la Salle today, at the 9:00 a.m. Mass. During this Rite, the Inquirers publicly declare their intention to continue their journey toward full initiation into our Faith Community. The priest calls each inquirer by

name and then they will tell us what they are asking of our Church. Once the community accepts them, the Inquirers' publicly affirm their desire to follow the way of the Gospel. The Sponsors then sign the Inquirers' senses, strengthening them for their new way of life. The foundation text for their formation is the Bible. Following the prayers of petition, they are dismissed to focus specifically on the issues of Catholic Christian life as they emerge in the "Breaking Open of the Word." The parish community offer their support, witness and prayer during their journey.

Law and Order . . . and Grace

Her days start before dawn and go well into the evening. She runs back and forth from her cramped office to the courthouse; keeping up with the meetings and messages is a challenge.

She's an immigration lawyer.

Her clients are asylum seekers, unaccompanied minors and victims of violence. They have fled the trauma, persecution and violence of their home countries to seek a new life in America — an America that does not welcome them. She spends much of her time looking for clients who have suddenly "disappeared" in the cruel darkness of the system.

She's one of hundreds of attorneys across the country who work tirelessly to see that these migrants and their families understand their rights under immigration law and to advocate on their behalf. Her job is as much therapist as lawyer, trying to soothe their fears and provide good, accurate counsel, even when it's not good news.

She takes on a legal system that has become increasingly hostile to her clients — many seasoned lawyers have left the profession, citing emotional exhaustion. She has her moments when she too wants to walk away, but she refuses to give in. She sees her role as more than just filling out forms and attending court hearings — she's a defender of the rights guaranteed to all under our Constitution and a light of hope for those seeking a better life in the United States. That's the oath she took when she was admitted to the bar, an oath she continues to take seriously.

This attorney and attorneys like her are the "persistent widow" of today's Gospel: they are driven by justice and mercy; they fight on for "just decisions" for the poor, the powerless, the defenseless. All of us have witnessed such perseverance: in parents who continue to support their sons and daughters despite the messes they make of their lives; in couples who will not quit on each other but work together to mend their marriages; in those quiet, committed souls who do their jobs conscientiously not because of the money or demanding supervisors but because they know their work matters. Jesus honors such perseverance in the conviction that we are called by Christ to be the means for realizing the justice and peace of God in this time and place of ours.
