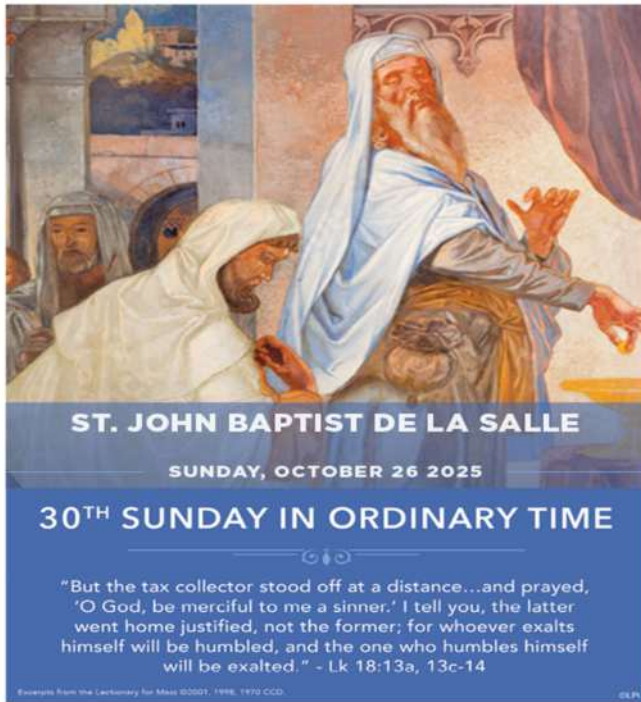




MISSION STATEMENT

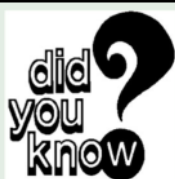

Who Is A Mandated Reporter?

A mandated reporter is someone who is required to report suspected or disclosed cases of abuse to child protective services or law enforcement including a wide range of persons from teachers, educators, coaches, to school and parish staff, and clergy. The mandated report may involve concerns about possible abuse or neglect in the child's home or by a family member. At a school or parish, if the person making a report believes that child abuse or neglect is the case then the person should make the report to the local law enforcement agency, which has the resources and ability to intervene immediately if needed. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles urges all in our church to speak up to the appropriate authorities if any form of child abuse is suspected. Right Now Matters . . .

A recent college graduate landed a job as nanny for a wealthy and extremely likable family. The family was wonderful — yet she grew more and more uncomfortable being a college graduate working as "a less-than-cool version of Mary Poppins."

While her friends were going off to law school or getting married or establishing careers in exciting cities, she was focused on "strategically placing Eggo waffles in the toaster so they didn't burn, while maintaining that crispy grid."

Time to start moving on to a "real job," she resolved, and started her search for a position that might lead to a career that "mattered."

But then came an "epiphany" moment. She was playing outside with her little charges when one of them came up and said, "You're so great. You don't even have to play with us but you do anyway. Our other nannies never did that. We love you."

"I was floored," the young nanny says. "Not only did I underestimate their ability to be gracious, but they made me realize that it's truly not about what life hands you but what you do with it . . . I could easily just patrol these girls, make sure they don't run out into the street or draw over the walls, but I don't. And together, we have perfected the fine art of Eggo toasting. How many people can say that?"

The lesson in all of this?

"Self-worth is where you find it and that the most beautiful form of self-worth occurs when you maximize the amount of love you share with the world, no matter how mundane or humble the circumstances may be."

For many of us, Jesus' parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector often plays out as moving from the self-importance of the Pharisee to the humility of the tax collector, from placing a value on our own self-centered accomplishments to realizing instead the spirit of God in our midst in the simplest act of generosity and grace. Our most fitting prayer to God for his many blessings to us is to return God's love and grace to one another, by accepting one another as God has accepted us; we honor God as Father of us all by honoring one another as sisters and brothers. It's the humble attitude of the tax collector that leads us to prayer that illuminates our spirits and attitudes, inspiring us to realize God's vision of peace and compassion for all humankind.
