


First Friday Holy Hour for Vocations **December 5, 2025**

During the holidays, many people travel to see family. It's important to be prepared for any dangers of traveling, including human trafficking — and to know the facts about



Beware of the scribes in Middle School . .

It happens at schools across the country. This particular day it happened at a Middle School in South Carolina.

And one dad would have none of it.

A group of seventh-grade girls are talking, and suddenly, one of the girls, Ryan, is teased about what she wears. The other girls join in the teasing. The teasing becomes more and more cruel. Poor Ryan is reduced to tears. This is not the first time she has been the target of such bullying.

When Ryan returns home, her mom asks what's wrong and Ryan pours out the story of what happened. When her mom asked her who the girls were, it turns out one of the girls is the daughter of one of her mother's friends. So Ryan's mom called the girl's parents — and the girl's father quickly responded. He had been bullied when he was in school and understood exactly how Ryan felt.

So he confronted his daughter. The following Saturday his daughter was supposed to go shopping for new clothes for school — but instead, her dad said, she was to take Ryan shopping with the money that had been set aside for her new clothes. Given his daughter's love of fashion and clothes, he thought this would be the perfect punishment.

And it was.

Ryan's young life has been hard of late: she has been struggling with the deaths of her father, grandfather, and aunt; the stress has caused her to suffer non-epileptic seizures. The shopping spree was an experience of hope for Ryan. "This is the first time I have seen a parent take such a stance on bullying," Ryan said.

Her mom's friends' daughter learned an important lesson. In fact, she helped Ryan pick out her new clothes.

The afternoon of shopping turned out to be the beginning of a friendship between the two girls.

The arrogance of the scribes that Jesus condemns is very much alive and well in our own time. Too often we presume our economic status or education or race or gender make us superior to others, that we are entitled to more and better and have no hesitation to lord that superiority over others. The kingdom of God, however, is realized only in our embracing the spirit of servanthood that is at the heart of Jesus' Gospel: servanthood centered in respect for everyone as daughters and sons of God; servanthood that finds fulfillment and satisfaction in the love, compassion and kindness we can extend to others; servanthood that enables us to place the common good and the struggles of others before our own wants and narrow interests. The faithful disciple honors the dignity of the servant above the presumed power of the elite. To follow Jesus is to realize our need for one another and their need for us.
