

Learning From The Less-Than-Perfect

They had just moved into a new home. They were settling in nicely. The only space needing attention was his office — specifically, bookshelves for his mountain of books and projects (he's a college professor). Sturdy, well-made bookcases cost more than he wanted to spend, and he wanted no part of the kind of cheap particle board shelves they had in their first apartment. So he decided to build his own.

It didn't quite go as well as he had planned, writes the would-be carpenter, Brian Bantam. In an essay in **The Christian Century** [August 2025], Bantam, professor of theology at Garrett-Evangelical Seminary, writes that, despite his countless measuring and sketches, "the gaps were not quite flush and the angles a little off. There were so many trips back to the hardware store, so many 'how to' searches, so many times up and down the stairs to find my tape measure. More than once I thought that maybe a cheap set of shelves wouldn't be so bad. But the boards were already cut, so all I could do was keep going. It took longer than I thought it would, but there it was, sanded and painted, sitting under my window with books and bobbleheads all in their place. I could still see every gap, and it certainly did not look as neat as the cheap shelves, nor did it seem as unique as the expensive ones."

But Bantam says that every "gap" held a lesson — "a lesson I would not have learned with s shelf that came to me in a box."

"Every quick-build shelf or prepackaged meal or AI response bears the hidden cost of what I didn't get to learn. As we get increasingly accustomed to such things, something else gets stolen from us: the mistakes that help us grow. The next shelf I make will have edges that are more flush, because I'll remember that I need to measure all four corners of the wall. The sauce I make will have a little more flavor as I slowly play with the time or the temperature or the salt. If I just buy or subscribe to the life around me, I will miss the chance to learn the feel of different woods under my fingers or appreciate what an oak tree looks like before it becomes a board. I will miss the reminders that pieces do not always fit together the way we plan, that dough does not always rise the same way.

"These lessons aren't just about the things we make. They are also about the people we become: people who can attend to the imperfections in ourselves and in one another, who can adapt when materials don't quite work the way we expect them to, who are invested in things as more than what can be consumed and discarded, who move through the world a little slower."

In the parables of the unfinished tower and the king preparing for war, Jesus reminds us that we do not live the life of God by accident, that to live our baptisms demands committed focus and deliberate action. Pain, struggle, disappointment, and failure are crosses every one of us has borne and will bear in our lives. From these crosses, we learn what it means to be a complete, mature, fulfilled human being. Often the easiest, least demanding solution to a problem is neither the best nor the most effective course of action — that which demands the most of us, that which addresses the root of the problem, that which forces significant changes in our attitude and perspective is always the most effective and permanent way to confront a situation. That is the way of the cross. To live our baptisms in the spirit of Jesus means to be willing to take the more difficult road, to be willing to try and fail but to learn from our mistakes, to be willing to cope with the imperfect for the sake of the good and affirming.
