

### St. Timothy v. City of Brookings

St. Timothy's is a small Episcopal church of 100 parishioners in Brookings, Oregon. The soup kitchen the church began in 2009 has expanded into the full range of services for the homeless: free meals, hot showers and a weekly health and dental clinic.

Prior to the pandemic, St. Timothy's had been working with other churches in Brookings to offer free meals to the area's homeless and working poor — but when pandemic began, the other churches suspended their meal programs. St. Timothy's decided to go it alone. The little church began offering hot meals six days a week, serving up to 70 people each lunchtime.

But not everyone was happy with the work being done at St. Timothy's. Local residents were concerned about the noise, the safety and the cleanliness, as well their fear that their coastal city would become a haven for the poor and homeless. A group of residents petitioned the city council to put an end to it.

In response, the council required the church to obtain new permits, limit its hours of operation, and cut back its free meals from six days to two.

St. Timothy's abided by the new laws while struggling to meet the needs of Brookings' growing population of poor and indigent — but earlier this year, with the support of their bishop and diocese, St. Timothy's pushed back by filing suit in federal court against the city. St. Timothy's is asking the court to declare the ordinance invalid and seeks a permanent injunction to stop the city from enforcing the measure. In their suit, the church says the city's ordinance restricts "the free expression of their Christian faith, which calls them to serve others in need."

The rector of St. Timothy's, the Rev. Bernie Lindley, says the small church believes that its works with the homeless is about "building the kingdom of heaven" through taking on Jesus' work of healing, feeding and teaching.

"Well, what does it mean to build the kingdom?" Lindley asks. "Does it mean to feed people or does it mean just talk about stuff? As far as I know, building the kingdom means doing the best we can to alleviate human suffering."

### **PARISH TRAINING FOR NEW EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS AND ALTAR SERVERS**

St. Joseph the Worker Church will be having Eucharistic Adoration, Benediction, & Rosary every Friday of the month. Eucharistic Adoration will take place from 2:00 – 7:00 p.m. The Benediction will be at 7:00 p.m., followed by the Holy Rosary. **You can visit the Jubilee Door at that time.**

The Jubilee Year began on September 11, 2021, with an Opening Mass at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels and will continue until September 10, 2022, when a Closing Mass will be held at Mission San Gabriel Arcángel.

Twenty-two parishes around the Archdiocese have been designated special jubilee year pilgrimage sites . With the approval of the Holy See, a plenary indulgence, which removes the temporal punishment due to sins already forgiven, is granted to those who enter the holy door of any of the pilgrimage sites to pray with the condition that they have confessed their sins and have received Holy Communion.

## **Why Do Catholics Do That !**

**What is the meaning behind the making of the cross on our forehead, mouth and heart before the reading of the Gospel?**

It mirrors the blessing a Deacon receives prior to proclaiming the Gospel - "may God be in your mind, on your lips and in your heart as you proclaim His holy Gospel."

**Why does the Priest purify the chalices on the Altar now?**

The purification can be done at the Altar or at a side table, or it can be done after Mass. The Holy See issued a directive in 2007 that the ritual purification must be done by a priest, deacon, or installed acolyte. Since we depend so heavily on Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist to assist our clergy at all Masses, we do the ritual purification at the Altar and one of the extraordinary Ministers completes it after Mass with a more thorough washing of all the chalices.

## The gifts that are others . . .

We all have people in our lives whom we love — but there are probably one or two people whom we feel genuinely privileged to know, individuals who model the best of what we would like to be, who inspire us to do good things by the simple example and integrity of their lives, lives they live in joyful humility and singularity of purpose.

That person may be the teacher or professor who inspired us by opening doors of understanding and helping us realize our ability to walk through them; the wise aunt or uncle whose love and trust have become the gathering place for the whole family; or someone in the community or parish who instinctively knows the right thing to do or say in the most challenging of situations.

## Mass Etiquette

### 1. No bulletin reading during Mass.

Imagine if you invited a guest to your house and before dinner or during, they decided to read a magazine instead of talking to you. That is what is happening in God's house when you read the bulletin.

### 2. No Food and Drink in Church

The exceptions would be water for the priest and water for those who are ill. Bringing a snack into the church is not appropriate, because we want to set the Church apart as a place of prayer and reflection.
