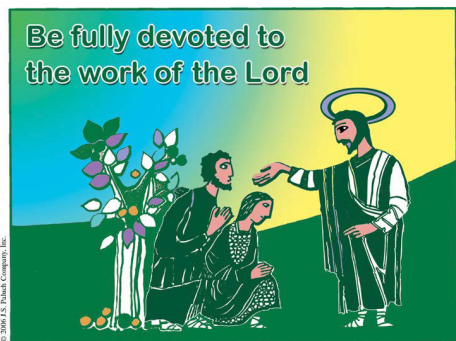

God transfigured in life's messes

A church organized a Tuesday morning mom-and-tots group, where the kids would play and the moms could indulge in adult conversation and sip coffee while it was still hot. The group became very close, laughing and crying, talking, and praying.

One day the group took up a book on prayer. The author wrote that making quiet time for personal prayer was crucial to the spiritual life. Most of the moms said they tried to fit in such "quiet time" during nap time, or laundry time, or dishwashing time, or shower time, but all agreed that a set daily "quiet time" was an impossible luxury. The book offered a solution for the quiet-time dilemma: "Get up earlier." All moms have to do is get up and have their quiet time in the dark before everyone else is awake, because, quoting the book, "you can sleep when you're dead." In other words, "a bunch of baby-brained, undernourished, zombie moms were being told that what they really needed to make their lives better was less sleep." One young mom spoke up: "Sleep was the one thing I knew I needed to have if I was going to be a decent mom for another day. I needed sleep, because my kids needed me to get dressed and go to the park and read the same book 400 times. and kiss boo-boos, and settle disputes over Legos, and cut a single grape into 11 pieces, and scoop turds out of the bathtub, and not kill anybody, either by accident or on purpose. Sleep was *life*." How could God entrust her, she asked, with the care and protection of three kids and then expect her to get up at the crack of dawn to "be quiet with him" because "I can sleep with him when I'm dead." "I don't think that's how it works. I really don't. I think God is with us. Like, day in and day out, in the chaos and the noise and the silliness of life, he is there, never absent from the clamor of our kids' laughter, their squeals, their skinned knees, their fussing, and whining, and raging fits in the Target parking lot. God is not withholding himself from us, waiting for us to come to him in the wee hours of the morning as a measure of our devotion!" "So I'm going to honor God intentionally in my sleep, because I'm pretty sure God wants me to be the very best mother I can possibly be to my boys. Tomorrow I'll be sleeping in. And I'm not even going to worry about it, because I'm pretty sure I'll have plenty of quiet time with God *when I'm DEAD!*"

The “Battered Child Syndrome” may indicate abuse

“Battered Child Syndrome” is a clinical term professionals use to refer to children experiencing recurrent physical abuse from a caretaker over an extended period of time. Signs of a battered child can include repeated bruising or bruising in unusual places, broken bones, scratches, and other injuries. Even if you do not see physical abuse happening, such injuries may be signs that a child is in danger in his or her own home. You should report any suspicious injuries or symptoms to a local child protective services agency, that report could save a child’s life. FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Abstinence from eating meat is to be observed on all Fridays during Lent. This applies to all persons 14 and older. The law of fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday applies to all persons 18 years and younger than 59. Fasting means that one full meatless meal per day may be eaten. Two other meatless meals may be taken sufficient to maintain strength, but together they should not equal a full meal. Liquids, including milk and fruit juice, may be taken between meals. If health or ability to work are affected, fasting does not oblige. Private, self-imposed observance of fasting on Lenten weekdays is strongly recommended. Pastors and parents should ensure that children, who are not bound by laws of fast and abstinence, are taught an authentic sense of penance, conversion, and reconciliation.

Great Things You Can Do for Lent

Besides giving up chocolate

1. Read the entire **Gospel of Mark** in one sitting. As the shortest Gospel, it is the most concise story of Jesus' life, and the cross, a central Lenten symbol, plays an even more prominent role than in the other Gospels.
2. Buy a book of daily reflections and keep it by your bed. Local parishes often offer these for purchase during Lent, and there are some good ones available online. Try the **Magnificat** or a book by **Edward Hays**.
3. Think about a habit that has kept you from being whom God is calling you to be. Consciously give up that.
4. Spend at least one weekend or evening volunteering during Lent. Serve a meal at your local soup kitchen. Visit the elderly. Stock shelves at a food pantry.
5. Go to a weekday Mass one day during the week. Many parishes offer them early in the morning, at noon, or after work. Daily Masses are often more intimate and shorter than Sunday Mass.
6. Be mindful of the words of philosopher Philo of Alexandria, who said, "Be kind, for everyone you meet is fighting a great battle habit for Lent."

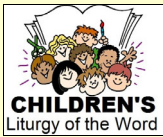

THE INSIDE SHOWS

In this third Sunday of our reading from the Sermon on the Plain, Jesus speaks of the inner soul and its outer expression. He uses images as he teaches. He addresses all of us. Jesus sees a plumb line connecting the soul with the soul's expression-words and actions. He uses exaggeration to drive home his point. We are urged to clear out the debris that blinds us. He knows that we have an uncanny ability to be blind to our own weaknesses, though they be as big as a board. He knows, too, how willingly we seem to ferret out others' smallest speck-like flaws. And this, too, is for our general consumption; solid old goodness and solid old badness will show eventually. The old Latin saying, which echoes Jesus' images, is true: "What is bred in the bone will out in the flesh." By and by, the inside will show through.
